City of Saskatoon Building Bylaw Updates

The City of Saskatoon City Council has updated its Building Bylaw and repealed its 25-year-old predecessor at its May 23 meeting. Updates to the bylaw will enhance program transparency by clarifying and clearly communicating application requirements and permitting conditions. New permitting conditions will reinforce and support good neighbour practices.

Full enforcement of the bylaw provisions is proposed for January 1, 2018. In the meantime, Akhil Kumar, Building Inspection Manager, is available for information sessions, presentations and/or questions. Please contact him directly at 306-975-2645 or by email.

Overall, the updated bylaw provides a platform to communicate building permit requirements and conditions in a clear and consistent manner, promote good neighbor practices through transparent building permit program administration, and support the city's strategic goals by balancing growth with accountability and public safety.
