New SAA Document - Does Your Project Need an Architect?

The SAA has recently completed work on a new communication regarding projects in Saskatchewan that require an architect titled, **Does Your Project Need an Architect?**. It is intended to provide information for SAA members and associates, planners, building officials, owners, developers, engineers, designers, and anyone interested in hiring an architect.

This document discusses how the practice of architecture is defined under *The Architects Act, 1996*, which buildings require an architect, and failure to comply with the requirements of the Act. The document also contains a chart that illustrates which buildings – by project type and size – require the involvement of an architect.
